



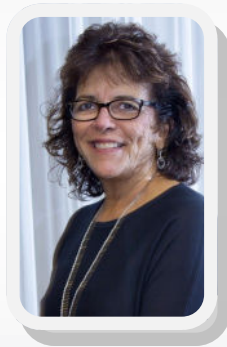

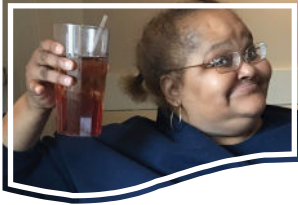

We recently visited with John and Sheila in Marion who shared their feelings on their new home.

CO-OP built this

home for four individuals who had spent time in nursing homes and moved in just before the 2016 holidays. Now, six months later, they are all settled in to their new life.

On the day we visited, the rain had finally stopped. The view outside the window was of an eyeeful of trees with very green leaves. Most of all, the smell of spring was in the air.

Living in Marion is somehow familiar to both John and Sheila, maybe because they both have roots on Cape Cod. For Sheila, it reminds her of her childhood. In fact, her grandmother had a house on the Cape and she and her family would visit her on weekends. For John, it's like being home again. He grew up in the area and has a number of family members who still live close to John's new home.

Both agree, living in Marion gives them something they did not have while living in a more urban environment or while living in nursing homes – fresh clean air. According to Sheila, "I love it. I love the staff. I wouldn't trade it..."

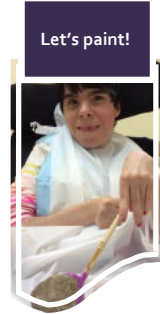
Our Kindness Rocks messages will be on display at a new Ingell Street rock garden,
